Our fundraising event at the CAA earlier this year was to help students at Newman House with the costs of their journey to Lourdes. The students – there were 20 of them in Lourdes this year – were there to tend to the sick and disabled at the St Frai hospital. The care that they give to those in need is incredible and everyone they help is so grateful to them all. I travelled to Lourdes with the students to the Westminster Pilgrimage on 27 July which was led by our President, Cardinal Vincent Nichols. We all went by Eurostar to Paris and then on to Montparnasse to catch the TVG to Lourdes where we arrived at 8.30 p.m. to be greeted by no less a person than the Cardinal!! Also with us were our three Associate Chaplains, Fr Chris Vipers, Fr Dennis Touw and Fr Dominic Robinson. On the day before we left, the Tour de France arrived in Lourdes for the first time since This was a very special time. They joined the 1945!!! torchlight procession (not riding their bikes!!) and were at Mass in the Grotto. Overnight the entrance to the domain was changed and there was a very festive atmosphere with lots of bikes around. Later on in the morning the bikers rode through the town with lots of spectators cheering them on their way. Our party arrived at Lourdes station at midday on the Friday to catch our train to Paris where we found that there WERE no trains due to a fire at Montparnasse. We didn't let this setback affect us and stayed waiting for a train and were rewarded for our faith when one appeared at 4 p.m. We arrived back at Paris at 1 a.m where we were looked after by the staff with a picnic and where we managed to have a few hours sleep before catching a train to the Gare du Nord to pick up the Eurostar to London. Next year, I think I might go to Skegness!!

Regrettably, I missed seeing **Dominic Hecht** who arrived with the Pilgrimage from Arundel and Brighton just as I left Lourdes.
